

Certified Nurse Aide (CNA) Licensure Disclosure

Upon completion of [NRS 106 Certified Nurse Aide \(CNA\)](#), students who pass the CNA test approved by the state of Montana will obtain their CNA certificate and become eligible to work in long-term care facilities and other healthcare environments. Upon successfully passing the Montana Certified Nurse Aide exams, administered by [D&S Diversified Technologies \(Headmaster\)](#), the student must complete an online [BOUNDS](#) Montana CNA by Exam Application. Once processed, the student will be placed on the Montana Certified Nurse Aide Registry.

Continuing education may also be required for the maintenance of licensure.
