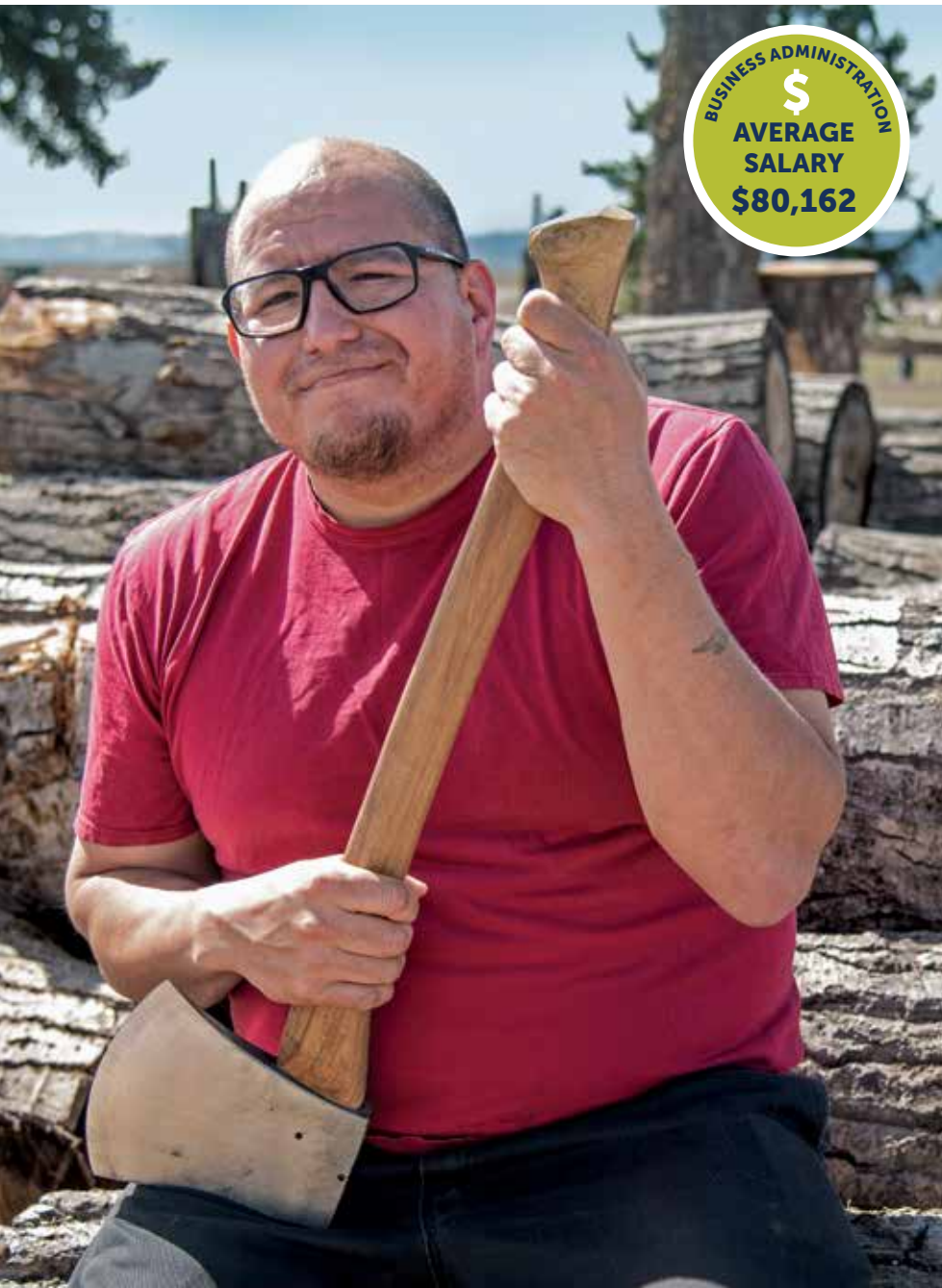

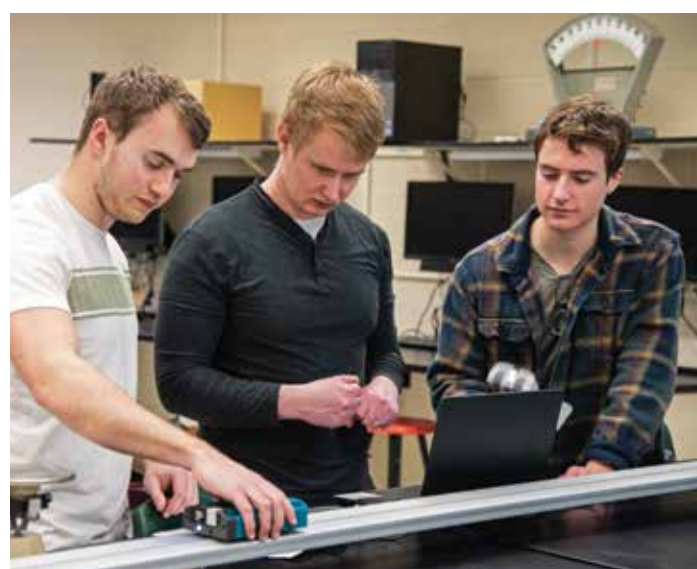

WAIVER

FVCC provides a number of discounts and tuition waivers to qualified students.

- **High School Honors Tuition Waiver**

Two free semesters of in-district tuition for top 10 percent of graduates from Flathead and Lincoln County high schools

- **Northwest Montana Attendance Area Waiver**

The top high school graduate, as determined by the high school, with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA from Arlee, Bigfork, Browning, Charlo, Hot Springs, Noxon, Plains, Polson, Ronan, St. Ignatius, Swan Lake or Thompson Falls receive a FVCC in-district tuition waiver for two semesters

- **FVCC Academic Scholarship Waiver**

Current students with an overall minimum 3.5 GPA after earning 30 credits from FVCC can receive two free semesters of in-district tuition

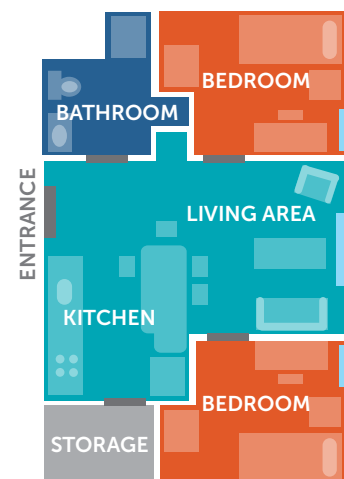

- Submit online FVCC application (Running Start students only need to update program in student portal from Running Start to degree seeking). fvcc.edu/apply
- Submit immunization records showing 2 MMRs (or a notarized religious/medical exemption form).

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). fvcc.edu/fafsa
- Watch for a letter from FVCC's Financial Aid office and return any required paperwork.
- Complete the Eagle Scholarship application if you have a 2.5 or higher cumulative high school GPA. Eagle Scholarship application opens on December 10 and is awarded on a first-come, first-served basis. fvcc.edu/scholarships
- Complete the Institutional Scholarship application. Application opens in early January and the deadline is February 15. fvcc.edu/scholarships
- On-campus housing application opens January 10 and is offered on a first-come, first-served basis. Make sure your application to attend FVCC is submitted at least one week before applying to live on campus. fvcc.edu/housing
- Meet with our disabilities services coordinator for any accommodation needs on campus. fvcc.edu/disability-support
- Apply for TRIO, a comprehensive academic support program for selected, eligible students. fvcc.edu/trio

- Complete placement testing for reading, writing and math or submit ACT scores and high school and/or college transcript of grades in progress. fvcc.edu/placement
- Honors Program applications for Fall semester open Spring semester and the priority deadline is May 1. fvcc.edu/honors
- STEM Experience applications for Fall semester open Spring semester and the priority deadline is May 1. fvcc.edu/stem

- Watch for an offer letter from the FVCC Financial Aid Office and return any required paperwork including thank you cards.

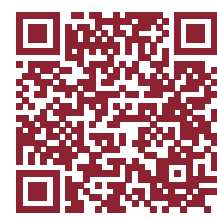
